General Information

Website

This year, the official website of COMUN has been redesigned. It provides visitors with updates and specific details about our conference. There is also a copy of the First Mailing on the site, as well as information about the committees and issues. Preparing for the conference and workshops

There are someways delegates can prepare for their debate, such as by reading the Research Reports. Research Reports will be written by the appointed Student Officers and published in advance of the conference. As soon as the reports have been finished, they can be found on the "Committees and issues" page on the website.

Although preparation for the conference is the responsibility of the delegations and their MUN Directors, the secretariat wishes all delegates with all distinct levels of experience to have an equally positive conference. This is why on the first day of the conference several workshops will be organized for participants. There will be workshops for lesser or inexperienced delegates to get used to the MUN Rules of Procedure. Additionally, there will be workshops for more experienced delegates, such as mock debates and speech writing. The exact content of the workshops will be determined in the following weeks. The secretariat would like to ask all delegates and delegations to fill out the following forms before the 15th of December, if interested in participating in the workshops on Friday morning.

Housing

COMUN provides Community Housing for participants, which have requested housing in de registration form. As the secretariat is dependent on volunteering families, we unfortunately can not guarantee accommodation for all delegations. If COMUN is unable to provide Housing for your school, you will be notified as soon as possible. In the fortunate case that housing is provided to your delegation, you will receive an email with a form where you can mention anything the organization needs to be aware of, like dietary restrictions, allergies, disabilities et cetera. Housing will be provided from Thursday until Sunday, delegates can store their belongings in a designated classroom in the main building on Sunday morning. It will be possible to leave those suitcases in the cloakroom of the school.

Payment

The invoices have been sent to all single delegates and delegations by our finance team. It is still possible to cancel your registration with a refund of the half of the fees until the first of December, after that any payments will not be returned anymore. Housing costs an additional €7,50 to the paid fees, once the executive staff team knows more about the programme delegations will receive an email about the payment.

Hotel recommendations

Best western Gouda

If you are staying in an hotel, the organization recommends you the Best Western Hotel in Gouda. It is located at approximately one kilometre from the Coornhert Gymnasium. This means it can be easily reached by walking or by renting a bike at the train station of Gouda. The hotel is right in the centre of the city and only a small walk away from the famous Gouda City Hall and lots of restaurants. Participants of COMUN can get a discount for this hotel for all rooms booked during the conference weekend. MUN Directors Historical Tour

For MUN directors there will be the possibility to take part in the traditional COMUN historical tour of Gouda. MUN directors who wish to take part in this tour can register on the Friday of the conference.

This tour will be given by our former Latin teacher and archaeologist Henk-Jan Sprokholt, who has a lot of knowledge about the city of Gouda. The tour will take you along historical sites such as the St. Jan church, the old City Hall, and the house where the famous humanist Desiderius Erasmus spent its youth.

Party

On Saturday night there will be a party for all delegates, student officers, staff members. The party will be from 20:30 till 00:30. At the party Dutch law concerning alcohol and drugs will apply and will be strictly followed by the staff of the location. There will be alcohol sold at the location, to ensure the safety of all attendants, those who are above the age of eighteen might get some form of bracelet as identification. The conference staff will be checking these at the party. The location will be announced later, in the Final Mailing.

Approval Panel

The Approval Panel needs to approve all resolutions, except in Crisis Committee, before committees can debate them. The Approval Panel is led by teachers and former students of the Coornhert Gymnasium. Volunteering MUN directors are also welcome to take part in the approval panel, since this will preserve the flow of all debates. We thank you in advance for your support.

Lunch

On Saturday and Sunday lunch will be provided by the conference and participants will therefore not have to provide their own lunch. On Friday, lunch will only be provided for students participating in the workshops in the morning, as lobbying time in all committees will start after lunch.

Rules of Conduct

Attendance and Roll calls

You are expected to always be present while your committee is in session unless you have permission from your MUN-Director to leave. Please inform your chair in a timely manner. Roll calls will be held by chairs at the beginning of every session, after lunch, and incidentally at random points during the course of the day to see which delegations are present. Unannounced absences will be reported to the Board of Directors and to the MUN Directors.

Dress code

COMUN is a model of a parliamentary organ. International politics are simulated as precisely as possible. To create the political surroundings and the formal atmosphere among participants that is needed to reach a high level of proficiency at the conference, a formal dress code will be applied during the entire conference. The dress code is mandatory for participants and kindly requested for MUN Directors and guests. Men should wear suits with (bow)tie and women should be dressed equally official. Sneakers, T-shirts or any other informal attire are unacceptable. The COMUN organization has the right to address participants on their attire.
